mLISD Information


Leander Mobile Learning Initiative (mLISD) supports the vision outlined in our Graduate Profile that "Leander ISD students are well prepared to enrich our world and excel in a global society" and that "each student is challenged, encouraged, and supported to achieve the highest level of knowledge, skills, and character" in a digital world.

Once again this year, students who are currently participating in the mLISD program have the option to keep their district devices over the summer. Students can begin to pay the support fee of \$70 (\$35 for students on free/reduced lunch) starting April 1, 2018. Scholarship opportunities are available and the application can be picked up in counseling office.

Starting this summer, Leander ISD will be providing Internet filtering for the Lenovo devices even when it is not attached to the district's network. Regardless of the location, the device will connect to the same filtering system the district provides on campus. Click HERE for more information/FAQ about the new filtering system.

Starting Sunday, April 1st, payment will be open for the 2018-2019 school year. For credit card payments, click HERE to sign-up and pay. Paying for College

Fill out the FAFSA!

SA is the most important tool students can use to access money for college. You can find many resources online at studentaid meantime, here are a few important points to keep in mind:

- Fill out the FAFSA at <u>fafsa.ed.gov</u>
- Requires both student and <u>parent info</u> (regardless of how much money parent(s) plan to contribute to the cost of college
- Students and parents must request an FSA ID prior to submitting the FAFSA this acts as the electronic signature
- Requires 2016 income tax info
- If your household has experienced a significant change in income since filing 2016 taxes, the student should contact the financial aid office of the school

Texas Success Initiative (TSI)

TSI is the standard students must meet in order to take classes for credit in college. TSI is not tied to high school graduation or college acceptance but must be met prior to college course registration. Students can meet TSI through either the SAT, ACT, or the TSI Assessment. Score standards are as follows:

SAT		ACT		TSI Assessment	
Composite	N/A	Composite (must meet in order for subscores to qualify)	23	Reading	351
Evidence Based Reading & Writing	480	English	19	Writing (Essay/Multiple choice)	4/340+ or 5/any score
Math	530	Math	19	Math	350

Taking the TSI

Students will have the opportunity to take the TSI Assessment here on campus at various times throughout the school year. Students will test only in the area(s) they still need to meet TSI and can register for any test date in Naviance \rightarrow Colleges tab \rightarrow Upcoming college visits

- March 3rd this is a Saturday test
- March 27th 8:30am-11:30am (attendance excused)
- April 19th 8:30am-11:30am (attendance excused)
- May 3rd 8:30am-11:30am (attendance excused)

If these dates do not work with scheduling, students can test at ACC for a cost of \$10/section.

Volunteer

Volunteers' tasks are limitless - including such things as tutoring & mentoring students, chaperoning school dances & field trips, helping with our athletic & band booster clubs, helping with textbooks, serving at Teacher Appreciations and helping out in the guidance office.

For the safety of our students, Leander Independent School District <u>requires</u> all potential volunteers who plan to work during the day or evenings (<u>before</u>, during & after school) supporting any Club/Organization/Sports team, etc. to receive a background check by the Department of Public Safety (DPS). This check will be completed using the Raptor Volunteer Management System.

Here is how someone can become an 'APPROVED' LISD Volunteer:

- 1. Complete and submit the *NEW* Raptor Volunteer Application:
- 2. English | Español
- 3. The background check should be complete in 2-3 business days.
- 4. Once approved, an email will be sent to the volunteer containing their login credentials and account information for their virtual volunteer profile.
- 5. When the volunteer is needed and it is during the school day, they <u>MUST</u> check-in at the front office and acquire a Volunteer Badge from the Receptionist.
