Assistant Principal's Message:

Regarding meals/food:

As stated in the High School Handbook, page 18: 'during meals, students are permitted only in designated areas. Students are not allowed to have food delivered to school from commercial establishments.'

Parents may provide food for their own child's consumption, they may not provide food items for other students.

Deliveries for students from Commercial Establishments:

In order to not interrupt the educational environment of our students, all attempted student deliveries from commercial establishments will be returned to the delivering establishments (ie: Uber deliveries, Tiff's Treats, Florists, etc.)

Dress Code:

We want to partner with you to ensure that Rouse is a learning environment that helps students grow academically, while also preparing them for the working world. As adults, we abide by dress codes at our workplaces everyday. Students at Rouse also need to abide by the LISD dress code. 
- Shorts, skirts, and skorts must be fingertip length

- No clothing that depicts messages of hate, violence, guns, drugs, alcohol, or drugs

Item Drop-off:

We would like to also encourage your student to come to school with everything they need for the day. This includes lunch/lunch money, school supplies, homework, athletic equipment, etc. However, we understand that occasionally the need arises to drop off an item. REGISTRATION FOR THE 2019 AP EXAMS IS NOW OPEN!

Regular registration opens November 1, 2018 for the 2019 AP Exams and remain open until Monday, March 4, 2019 This window will give families more flexibility on paying for their AP exams.

Students taking AP exams at Rouse High School must register for exams by 11:59 pm, March 4, 2019. Late registration will occur from March 5 - 6 for an additional \$25 fee.

AP Exams are an important piece of our students' college resume and can make a huge impact on college expenses by earning college credit through AP exams; therefore, LISD will be paying \$25 toward each AP exam to bring the cost from \$98 to \$73 per exam for the 2019 school year. Capstone Exams will be reduced to \$122. Students on free/reduced lunch pay \$20/exam and can indicate participation in the program on the registration form. Grants are available for students needing additional financial assistance. Please see Stephanie Chisholm, Dean of Instruction, for a grant application.

The Free Application for Student Aid (FAFSA) is now open for the 2019-2020 school year!

It is recommended that all students, regardless of income, submit a FAFSA. Many colleges and scholarships utilize the FAFSA for merit based and need based awards.

Completing the FAFSA early is more important than ever for Texas high school students. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board recently changed the state FAFSA priority deadline to January 15, 2019.

The ASVAB Career Exploration Program is a FREE test administered to all interested 10th-12th grade students. The ASVAB program facilitates career planning and exploration, combining a multiple-aptitude test with an interest self-assessment and wide range of career exploration tools. Students interested in the military absolutely should take this test, yet it is open to any student who simply is wanting more career guidance. We do not release scores or student information to the military.

- Check-in begins at 8:30am
- Test begins at 9:00am students will not be admitted into the room after the test has begun
- Testing ends 1:00pm (approx.)

This is a B-day - attendance is coded but make sure to check with your teachers ahead of time. Students are responsible for all missed assignments.

Volunteer

Volunteers' tasks are limitless - including such things as tutoring & mentoring students, chaperoning school dances & field trips, helping with our athletic & band booster clubs, helping with textbooks, serving at Teacher Appreciations and helping out in the guidance office.

For the safety of our students, Leander Independent School District <u>requires</u> **all potential volunteers** who plan to **work during the day or evenings** (<u>before, during & after school</u>) supporting any Club/Organization/Sports team, etc. to receive a background check by the Department of Public Safety (DPS). This check will be completed using the Raptor Volunteer Management System.

Here is how someone can become an 'APPROVED' LISD Volunteer:

- 1. Complete and submit the *NEW* Raptor Volunteer Application:
- 2. English | Español
- 3. The background check should be complete in 2-3 business days.
- 4. Once approved, an email will be sent to the volunteer containing their login credentials and account information for their virtual volunteer profile.
- 5. When the volunteer is needed and it is during the school day, they <u>MUST</u> check-in at the front office and acquire a Volunteer Badge from the Receptionist.
